

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Talachulitna River Location:

The Talachulitna River is a stream perfectly created for angling success. Its crystal clear water meanders through unspoiled Alaskan wilderness 65 miles from the nearest road. Numerous sandbars and shallow riffles offer easy wading access to the many deeper pools teeming with the Salmon, Rainbow Trout, and Arctic Grayling.

In this ideal setting, anglers from all over the world have experienced vacation dreams come true while fishing these abundant waters and enjoying all the comforts afforded at Talaview Lodge.

Accommodations:

Talaview Lodge is a masterpiece of native log construction and design complete with massive stone fireplace and generous furnishings. Large picture windows and spacious open deck offer a splendid view of the snow capped mountains.

You'll find the two standard cabins, with large picture windows, bunkhouse arrangements, and woodburning stoves, very comfortable. Each of these economical cabins will sleep four people.

After a long, satisfying day on the river, nothing refreshes you more than a hot and relaxing shower. Showers are conveniently located in the

bathroom near the standard cabins. The two large

bathrooms are equipped with sink, shower, flush toilet, hot and cold running water, and electricity which is generated by the lodge's own power plant. Fresh towels and supplies are replenished daily for your use.

Talaview's deluxe, private cabins offer unsurpassed wilderness living! Three spacious units are available, each with one double bed and two twin beds. These cabins are

carpeted, generously furnished, and equipped with airtight woodburning stoves, full bathrooms and daily maid service. Picture windows afford a spectacular view of the mountains.

Dining:

Old-fashioned hospitality abounds at the lodge when everyone gathers in the dining areas for Alaskan Cuisine style meals. Dishes are proudly prepared "from scratch" and served in generous portions. Specializing in a variety of breads and desserts baked fresh daily, you'll see why Talaview Lodge is famous for its food.

Salmon:

There are five species of Pacific Salmon, and all of them migrate annually to the Talachulitna River.

The first to arrive in mid-June is the mighty Chinook (or King) Salmon. This big fish is generally taken on large spinning tackle. However, many flyfishermen have experienced the ultimate in angling adventure when a King has taken their weighted streamer fly.

The last week of July and throughout August, the Tal is home again to the Chum and Pink Salmon. The Chum is a large, powerful fish and provides a thrilling contest. You will marvel at the sheer number of Pink Salmon which inhabit the Tal. Beginners and children will have a heyday when

nearly every cast produces a strike!

The entire month of August finds the Coho (or Silver) Salmon entering the Tal. They are fresh, strong, and of perfect eating quality. The Silver will strike flies and lures with equal zest and are truly a sportfisher's dream come true. These salmon are well known for their acrobatic leaps and sizzling runs for deeper pools.

Rainbow Trout and Arctic Grayling:

As the King Salmon begin spawning the last three weeks of July, anglers will find excellent Rainbow Trout fishing here on the Tal. Typically, the weather is warm and sunny, creating perfect water conditions for a memorable fly fishing experience!

During August and September, the Tal is teeming with large numbers of Arctic Grayling (averaging 14 to 18 inches) content to strike just about any fly or lure. Dry fly fishing on a sunny afternoon can produce outstanding results even for the novice!

September finds the larger (22 to 26 inch) Rainbow Trout, fat and strong from their summer feeding, aggressively "storing up" for the long winter ahead. The Rainbow Trout of the

Talachulitna River are wild, native trout famed for their brilliant crimson markings and distinctive black spots.
